Ruth – Set in the dark and bloody days of the Judges. It does not speak of the underlying hostility and suspicion of the two peoples; how the Judahites and the Moabites felt for each other. But Ruth was written in a time of peace between Israel and Moab.

Ruth was a young woman of Moab and the great-grand mother of David. She was an ancestress of David.

NOTE: There are only two (2) books in the bible that are named after a woman. Do you now the other book? It is Esther.

About the Book: It was a delightful account of true faith and piety (devotion) in the period of judges. The author is unknown. Although some think Samuel, it is unlikely due to the mention of David. It implies a later date than Samuel. Because of the literary style, it is suggested it was written during Monarchy (Kingdom). *Do you know more?*

Theme: Unswerving and selfless devotion to Naomi. Boaz kindness to the two widows. He is an example of the self-giving love that fulfill God's law.

Ruth is a Moabite and reflects God's love. Yet her complete loyalty to the Israelite family to which she is a worthy ancestress of David. She exemplifies what is the truth that participation in the kingdom of God is decided not by blood, or birth, but by the conformity of one's life to the will of God through the obedience that comes from faith. Her place in the ancestry of David signifies that all nations will be represented in the kingdom of David's greater Son.

Ruth sheds light on David's role in the History of Redemption. It is the primary story of Naomi's transformation from despair to happiness.
