THE <u>WHERE</u> QUESTION INQUIRES ABOUT LOCATION.

WHERE ARE THEY WHEN THIS STORY TAKES PLACE.

Investigative Question 5: Why?

THE WHY QUESTION ASKS ABOUT THE REASONS OR CAUSES FOR A CONDITION, ACTION OR ASSERTION.

Context Principle

Keep the writer's point of view in the forefront.
